community.
1. Why would you like to attend Lead On 2017 for Peace and Equality in Alaska?
2. What do you like to do in your home community? (List your favorite activities at home, school, church or other groups you are part of or activities you do after school).
3. At Lead On we will talk about ways to help make our communities happier, safer and healthier places to live. What ideas do you have for helping your community be happier, safer and healthier?
4. Who is someone that you see as a leader in your family, school or community and why?
5. During Lead On we will also discuss healthy lifestyles and different problems that many students, families and communities face. What is a problem you see in your community that you would like to focus on preventing and why? (For example: tobacco use, bullying, dating violence, teen pregnancy, etc.)

6. Healthy relationships and nonviolence are important parts of Lead On. Why do you feel it is important to talk about these issues?
7. During Lead On we will be learning about a variety of topics around healthy sexuality. What topics are you interested in learning more about when it comes to Teen Sexual Health? (Lists of examples are given below, but feel free to include additional subjects of interest that are not mentioned.
■ ■PUBERTY & ADOLESCENT DEVELOPMENT- ex. emotional, social and cognitive impacts of adolescence, body image and the influence of those around us, decision making relating to sexual health.
[2] IDENTITY- ex. difference between sex and sexual orientation, and gender identity, analyze the influence of those around us on gender, sexual orientation and identity.
PREGNANCY AND REPRODUCTION- ex. influences that may impact decisions of whether to or when to engage in sexual behaviors; access medically accurate information about contraception.
② SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED DISEASES & HIV- ex. common symptoms of and treatments for STDs, including HIV; Explain how to access local STD and HIV testing and treatment services; Demonstrate skills to communicate with a partner about STD and HIV prevention and testing
PERSONAL SAFETY- ex. Compare and contrast situations and behaviors that may constitute bullying, sexual harassment, sexual abuse, sexual assault, incest, rape and dating violence; Access valid resources for help if they or someone they know are being bullied or harassed, or have been sexually abused or assaulted
